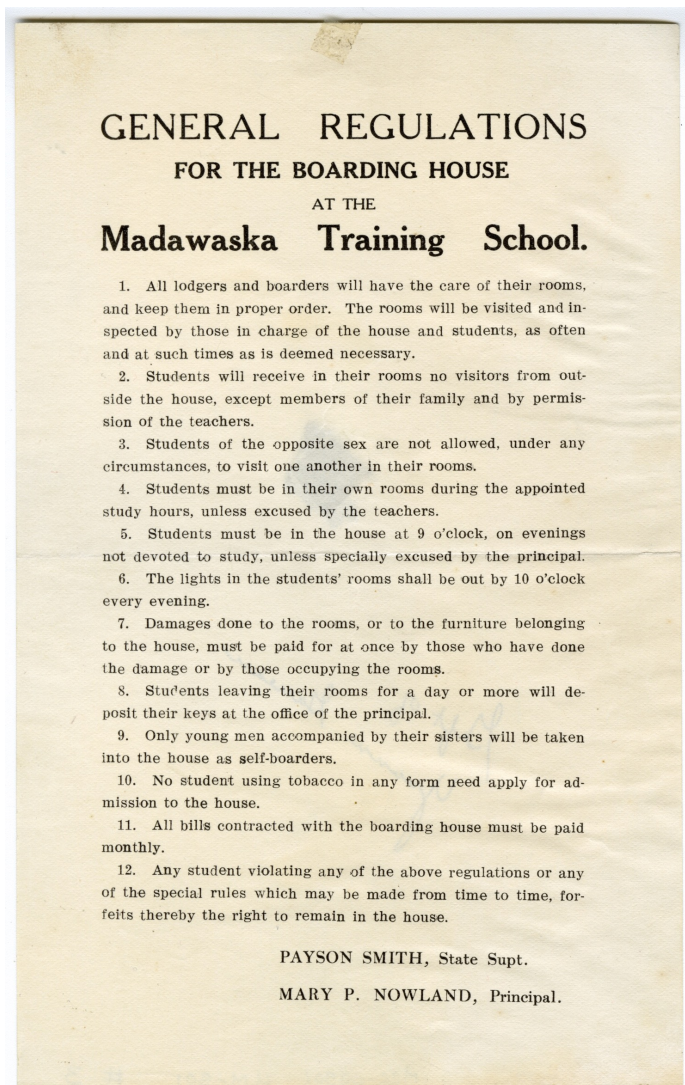


General Regulations
for the Boarding House
at the
Madawaska Training School.



1. All lodgers and boarders will have the care of their rooms, and keep them in proper order. The rooms will be visited and inspected by those in charge of the house and students, as often and at such times as is deemed necessary.
2. Students will receive in their rooms no visitors from outside the house, except members of their family and by permission of the teachers.
3. Students of the opposite sex are not allowed, under any circumstances, to visit one another in their rooms.
4. Students must be in their own rooms during the appointed study hours, unless excused by the teachers.
5. Students must be in the house at 9 o'clock, on evenings not devoted to study, unless specially excused by the principal.
6. The lights in the students' rooms shall be out by 10 o'clock every evening.
7. Damages done to the rooms, or to the furniture belonging to the house, must be paid for at once by those who have done the damage or by those occupying the rooms.
8. Students leaving their rooms for a day or more will deposit their keys at the office of the principal.
9. Only young men accompanied by their sisters will be taken into the house as self-boarders.
10. No student using tobacco in any form need apply for admission to the house.
11. All bills contracted with the boarding house must be paid monthly.
12. Any student violating any of the above regulations or any of the special rules which may be made from time to time, forfeits thereby the right to remain in the house.
